## Request:

Good afternoon, I would like to obtain the following information under the Freedom of Information Act in relation to IAPT worker performance targets and staff wellbeing. The IAPT manual <a href="https://www.england.nhs.uk/wp-content/uploads/2019/02/improving-access-to-psychological-therapies-manual.pdf">https://www.england.nhs.uk/wp-content/uploads/2019/02/improving-access-to-psychological-therapies-manual.pdf</a> published June 2018 states: "8.1.4 Capacity and demand modelling For high-intensity therapists it is generally considered that achieving 20 face-to-face clinical hours per week is appropriate for a full-time, fully trained individual, with pro-rata reductions for part-time workers, trainees and those with supervision or management responsibilities.

Working towards achieving 18-20 clinical hours per week is generally appropriate for a fulltime, fully trained PWP, with pro-rata reductions for part-time workers, trainees and those with supervision or management responsibilities. More than 20 clinical contact hours is not recommended and may be detrimental to both wellbeing and clinical effectiveness"

Question 1. Do you follow these guidelines in your IAPT service(s) for PWP and High Intensity Therapists? If you do follow these guidelines, do you interpret these guidelines as being delivered contacts i.e. 20 hours attended or 20 hours offered i.e. excluding cancelled by professional? If you do not follow these guidelines, please indicate the targets you work to in your IAPT service(s) i.e. number of contacts, delivered hours etc

Answer: The Trust follows the IAPT manual and interprets these guidelines as

being 20 hours of attended contacts. This is not necessarily the same as 20 contacts, as some appointments are 30 minutes and others are

two hours.

Question 2. Please advise your average vacancy rate in your IAPT service(s) in 2018/19 (or from the point that you implemented the guidance

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Answer: The average vacancy rate for IAPT services is 11%.

Question 3. Please advise your average sickness rate in your IAPT service(s)

in 2018/19 (or from the point that you implemented the guidance

from the IAPT manual)

Answer: The Trust's average sickness rate in IAPT Services is 3.21%

Question 4. Please advise your average sickness rate in your IAPT service(s)

in 2018/19 (or from the point that you implemented the guidance from the IAPT manual) where the reason for absence is \$10 Anxiety/stress/depression/other psychiatric illnesses

Answer: The Trust's average sickness rate in the IAPT services for the reason

of anxiety/stress/depression/other psychiatric illnesses is 0.92%.
