

Data Protection Impact Assessments

To ensure each new regular use of information is legal, we undertake a [Data Protection Impact Assessment \(DPIA\)](#), which is a risk assessment recommended by the [Information Commissioner's Office \(ICO\)](#), which is the regulator of the Data Protection Act 2018. These assessments are processed by the Trust's Information Governance Team and approved by the Trust's [Data Protection Officer \(DPO\)](#).

To make sure we are being transparent with our patients about what we are doing with their information, we regularly publish and update our most recent list of approved DPIAs.

| Tractivity | Tractivity is a stakeholder engagement platform. Tractivity keeps all information relating to stakeholders and engagement in one place thereby negating the need for separate email, correspondence and folder trails |
| Falsified Medicines | The Falsified Medicines Directive [FMD] (Directive 2011/62/EU) was published on 1st July 2011 introducing a range of safety measures to ensure that Prescription Only Medicines with a marketing authorisation in the EU are safe and that the trade in medicines is properly controlled. Its aim was to significantly reduce the risk of counterfeit medicines reaching patients |
| Pro Scan | Pro Scan is approved for staff at the continuing care team to have this app installed on their encrypted work phone. They work with babies and children with complex care and would use this app to scan documentation from other organisations that the child is receiving care from and email it to themselves via secure NHS Mail and upload it onto Rio once back to base. Once uploaded, emails are deleted. |
