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

#### **Understanding Disability**

#### The Social Model of Disability

- The Social Model of Disability holds that people with impairments are 'disabled' by the barriers operating in society that exclude and discriminate against them.
- It states that people have impairments but that the oppression, exclusion and discrimination people with impairments face is *not* an inevitable consequence of having an impairment, but is caused instead by the way society is run and organised.

### UN Convention of Rights of Persons with Disabilities

"to promote, protect, and ensure the full and equal enjoyment of all human rights and fundamental freedoms by all persons with disabilities, and to promote respect for their inherent dignity."

#### Cultural Model of Disability

"views disability as a site of resistance to socially constructed conceptions of normality."
