## Step 1-Planning together:

- Idea discussed with Professional Development Lead for AHPs, Community Deputy Lead OT, Head of Complex Care & University
- **Created project opportunity for a business case**
- Advertised placement to final year students

## Step 3-Outcomes:

- ✓ A positive experience for educators and student
- Recognition of value of OT input in complex cases & submission of business case
- Successful recruitment of student in current post

# Aim:

- Create a meaningful
  - leadership placement
- Develop an Occupational Therapy post within Complex Care service

#### **Step 2-Doing together:**

- 2 days clinical-2 days leadership-1 day alternate
- Leadership skills: gathering clinical evidence, reading literature, contributing on writing business case, attending meetings with various stakeholders
- Clinical skills: carrying small case load, assessments, group/1:1 interventions, MDT meetings
