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Aim

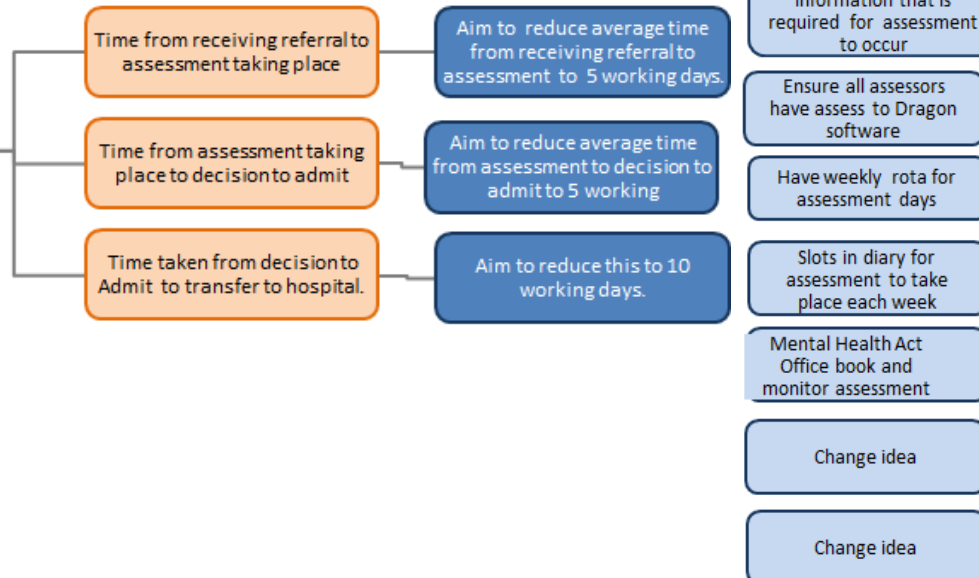
A reduction in 10 % in overall time from point of received referral to JHC to point of admission for male patients with primary diagnosis of mental illness from prison.

Why is this important to service users and carers?

Service users want to spend as little time as possible in hospital and get back to their life in the community. To achieve this we have to ensure that there are efficient care pathways for prisoners from their time of referral to hospital to admission. This will give clear definition to staff of what their role is and how they can play a part in achieving this.

Driver diagram

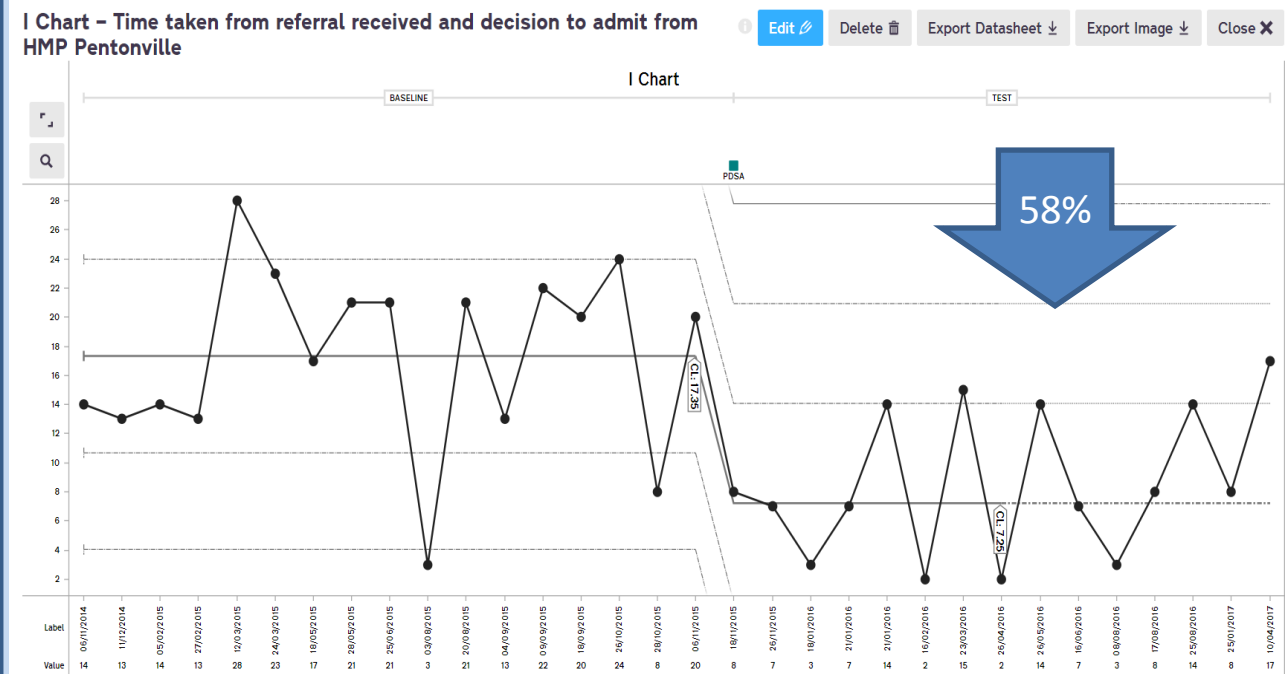
10% reduction in time taken from receiving referral to admission to hospital

Interventions to reduce the time taken from a referral being received by JHC till the point when the patient is actually admitted to the JHC>
