


## Reduction in disturbances to the Nurse during medication rounds on Cazaubon Ward



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
#### Aim

A 50% reduction in disturbances to the Nurse during medication rounds on Cazaubon Ward by June 2016




# Why is this important to service users and carers?

Nurses and being called away from medication rounds to deal with other things. This disturbance has the potential to cause missed doses or medication errors.




### **Driver diagram**

- Utilising other staff during the medication round
- Tabards
- Signage
- Set drug round times publication
- adjust timings of certain drugs
- Quiet catch up time
- Cut off time for administration
  Peer 2 peer checks

There was not enough data to analyse to assess whether there was a sustained change... But! The nurses also found both change ideas as useful intervention. In the future... base line data to be collected over a sufficient time scale to clearly define how much

improvement was made over the period the QI took place
